You probably saw some of her BoatSmart notices published regularly in the Post and Courier, Summerville and James Island newspapers. In addition, Joan was able to place recorded radio and TV spots with local broadcasting stations during National Safe Boating Week. The PR highlight of the year was Charleston Power Squadron members Janice and Steve Kromer's television appearance on "Low Country Live" May 22, 2006 on Channel 4 WCIV. The show was hosted by Justin Lock and Ryan Nelson and featured the Charleston Power Squadron's activities during National Safe Boating Week. Segments of the show were recorded during a Vessel Safety Check of Art Clark's boat "Sunday Drive." In the live segment of the show, Janice and Steve discussed boating safety equipment and invited the public to sign up for the Squadron's safe boating classes.

Boating Safety Officer John Sikes did an excellent job writing a monthly safety column for the Palmetto Log. SINKING


recent article on the subject in a boating maga zine reported a large number of boats t h a t sank while underway. In each case, the operator was apparently not aware that the boat was taking on water while cruising along. One incident was caused by sea water entering the hull through engine room vents. This sank the boat with loss of two lives.

The sources of leaks are numerous and they are often small at the start. A leaking stuffing box, a loose clamp on a seawater hose, a leak at a seacock, or a splash through an open port light in the engine room have all been credited as the source of disasters.

A simple device called a bilge water alarm could have prevented all or most of these accidents. To be effective, the bilge water alarm switch must be carefully located where water accumulates when underway at cruising speed. The alarm must be loud enough to hear over engine noise and other underway sounds. Failure to observe the bilge pump light while navigating or operating in rough water can also cause a sinking disaster.

We should keep a "heads up" for this on our vessels and remember to emphasize this point on the ramp or in the classroom.

Executive Committee Meeting 7 September 2006

The meeting was called to order by Cdr Janice Kromer at 1830 at Headquarters.

Attendees: Lt Gene Gilfillin, Carol Gilfillin, P/Lt/C Cindy Dridler, P/R/C Ed Kridler, 1st/Lt Chet Rogers, P/C Billy Lynes, Lt/C Steve Kromer, Lt Mike King, Lt/C David Walsh, Lt Wendy Walsh, Lt John VanWay, Lt/C Chuck Altschul, 1st/L Joan King, Cdr Janice Kromer, Lt/C Art Clark

A quorum was established.

The minutes from July & August Executive Committee meeting were accepted with one correction, the spelling of Elise Jorgens' name.

Executive: Lt/C Dave Walsh reported that three members are participating in Co-op Charting training. The January boat show is in the works. Lt/C Dave Walsh will get an insurance certificate so we can participate.

Education: Lt/C Steve Kromer reported that there are at least 10 people taking Engine Maintenance, and eight in Piloting.

The Parade of Boats plans are progressing. We may need two judges.

Administration: Lt/C Art Clark reported that there are 32 people signed up for the membership meeting at The College of Charleston. Lt/C Clark has been in contact with the Coast Guard Auxiliary about co-operating on safe boating classes. There are now two Coast Guard Auxiliary units in the Charleston area. The new one is in Mt. Pleasant. Their equivalent to Boat Smart has a total cost of \$55.00. They have good participation, and do mention us as a "Safe Boating" organization during their classes.

Secretary: No report

Treasurer: Lt/C Chuck Altschul reported there is \$16,000 in the bank. His report shows a \$2,172.98 income for the year. Chuck has investigated obtaining a credit line on the Headquarters building, to be used in case of an emergency need, such as the roof or air conditioner. Lt Mike King made a motion to proceed with obtaining the credit line. Motion was seconded by Lt/C Steve Kromer and passed.

Commander: Cdr Janice Kromer reported that Stf/C Harl Porter attended the Governing Board meeting in New York. The plan to discontinue membership requirements for taking courses was tabled until next year. The dues structure was changed for National membership. The initiation fee will now be \$25.00 per family instead of the old \$10.00 per person. Annual dues will be \$85.10 per person or 150% of the individual for an entire family. There will no longer be individual family memberships or second full membership within a family.

Committee reports:

Audit Committee: No report

Housing Committee: Lt Wendy Walsh reported that a new toilet has been installed in the men's bathroom. We need a piece of

flooring because the foot print of the toilet is different. The columns in the front for Headquarters building need to be changed. It was suggested that she contact P/C Steve Yeomans. The building will be washed and the carpet cleaned in the near future.

Nominating Committee: No report

Rules Committee: P/Lt/C Cindy Kridler reported that our revised By-laws have been approved but without a decision on electronic voting. Since electronic voting was the main issue that we wanted to clarify, we will wait for that decision before officially changing the By-laws.

Unfinished Business: Lt/C Chuck Altschul presented the budget for 2007 (attached). Dues income shows as a lower figure because of National billing. There is a small increase from last year's budget to cover increase costs. The expenses for the Palmetto Log and roster are down. There was a question about the cost of the Parade of Boats, Lt/C Steve Kromer said there was a donation that covered all cost associated with the parade last year. There is no plan to incur costs this year.

P/R/C Ed Kridler suggested that we hold fund-raisers and designate the funds for the building upkeep and maintenance. Lt/C Dave Walsh will seek a few people to work as a fund-raising committee.

P/Lt/C Cindy Kridler asked if we could have a line item designated for building maintenance.

1stLt Joan King reminded the group that there was a motion at the August Executive Committee to set up the Building Fund account with a transfer of \$3,544.16. This is an estimate of the amount that was in the Building Fund before the theft took place. Cdr Janice Kromer directed Lt/C Chuck Altschul to add the Building Fund as a separate balance sheet account. The \$3,544.16 that will be shown in that account will be deducted from the general operating figures shown this month. The actual monies will be kept in the regular checking and money market accounts.

Lt/C Steve Kromer made a motion to accept the budget. The motion was seconded by L/C Art Clark and passed.

Cdr Janice Kromer said if we wish to change our dues structure to match the new national structure, we must do it now. After much discussion it was determined that it is too late to do it this year. We will keep our structure the same for 2007.

New Business: There has been a complaint that people earning merit marks should attend membership meetings. Cdr. Janice Kromer said we do keep records of the number of people who attend our meetings and that information is reported to national. There is no requirement for meeting attendance but a person may not be awarded a merit mark for just attending meetings, they must be performing some job that is beneficial to the Squadron.

Lt John VanWay asked if we have ever had the Headquarters building treated for termites and if we have a termite bond. Lt/C Chuck Altschul reported that we do not pay an annual fee so we probably don't have a bond. Lt Wendy Walsh will look into this and report next month.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
